FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

We are just finishing (hopefully) a remodel of our upstairs bathroom. We chose some tile with variegated color—mostly mossy greens with some undertones of gold, brown, and terra cotta. I fell in love with the colors in the tile, and it became the center point for choosing wall color, cabinetry finish, countertop, and everything else. I didn't know from the outset what it would all look like, but the pieces and colors began to be "in conversation" with each other, developing into a whole *gradually*.

I am reminded that every project we do has to have a compelling center, a guiding point, in order for the process of "conversation" to develop around it. The continuing education event I just attended was titled "Holy Conversation: Strategic Planning as Spiritual Process". Clearly, as disciples of Jesus Christ, our "compelling center" is to live as faithful followers.

But what does that look like?

In order to let God shape us into the people we are called to be, we have to do some reflection and get clear about *our most compelling values and calling as a church*!

Ours is a church woven together of varied and beautiful souls, bound by the warp and weft of a gracious God. We are a church with many gifts and graces. We also face challenges financially with every budget we put together. As a group of members agreed recently, we are a mature congregation that needs to have intentional conversation—with one another, with God—about our future so that we can continue to be full of God's life, to be clear about our ministry in this place and time, and to be renewed by God's vision for us. Call it "visioning" or "Holy Conversation" or "strategic planning" – I call it essential.

Three primary questions to ponder and pray over:

WHO ARE WE? What is our unique history that makes us who we are as a congregation today? What are our gifts and graces? What are the choices that have shaped us as a church?

WHY HAS GOD PLACED US HERE? Are we a downtown congregation, or a congregation that happens to be downtown? What are our unique opportunities for ministry and service in Bemidji? On Beltrami Avenue? What are we called to do? WHO IS OUR NEIGHBOR? Who have we been placed here to serve and love?

I hope you will each give time and thought to these questions as we enter a period of discernment for our church's on-going and future ministry: a "Holy Conversation". God isn't finished with us yet!





May 24, 2013—A Special Date for Recollection and Reflection

Two hundred seventy-five years ago (1738) on May 24, John Wesley had a "heart warming" religious experience at a small Moravian meeting in Aldersgate Street, London, which changed the trajectory of his ministry—initiating what became the Methodist Movement (now spanning the entire globe, with over 76 million members in 138 countries).

One hundred fifteen years ago (1898) also on May 24, the first Methodist sermon was preached in Bemidji, Minnesota, evolving into the present day Bemidji United Methodist Church—a latter day manifestation of the Methodist Movement.

Wesley's passion was to reach those most in need of hope, so he took to preaching wherever and whenever he could reach the masses—whether at the mine heads (at 5am), in the public square or open fields (even from his father's grave stone when the Epworth parish church was closed to him). His concern for the poor led him to open free medical dispensaries, homes for orphans and widows, establish lending societies, and fight the slave trade.

It was serious business to be identified as a Methodist. There were riots instigated by those opposed to Wesley's ministry and some followers were martyred!

Wesley gathered those who wished his spiritual guidance into small groups of a dozen or so members to meet weekly with an appointed leader for prayer, Bible study, and to inquire as to how each prospered spiritually (ie. to rebuke and /or encourage as indicated). To join, one needed only "to repent of his/her sins and wish to flee from the wrath to come." To continue as a member, one was expected to follow the "Rules of the Society of the People called Methodists," namely:

- 1. Do no harm.
- 2. Do good.
- 3. Stay in love with God (ie. Pray, read the scripture, attend the services of the church, commune regularly and perform other acts of devotion not unlike Jesus' "Great Commandment" to love God and Neighbor).

As a congregation we will be observing a special "Wesley Day" event later in the year with fun, food, fellowship, and worship. We will also celebrate our local church's one hundred fifteenth anniversary in November.

However, what better time than May 24, 2013 can we, as individuals, take the "Rules of the Society of the People called Methodist" seriously and deliberately concentrate on making them a more vital part of our lives? That would really make <u>May 24, 2013</u> a special date for each of us!

We seek their active involvement by making recommendations for changes and improvements to policies, procedures, forms and other materials to be used by Churches United. This helps Churches United to work cooperatively with representatives of Social Service organizations, local businesses, churches and government agencies to promote a good working relationship between Churches United and our community.


