Dear Church Family,

This has been a difficult week. Many of you may have heard about the Greenwood fire in the news. You may have even experienced some smoke from that fire in Bemidji. Greenwood Lake is just a little ways from our family cabin on Sand Lake. The western edge of the fire is only about a half mile from our cabin. We've been one wind shift away from destruction of the cabin that has been in Michelle's family since the late 1930's.

We are thankful for the work of the firefighters and forest service. The area has been evacuated. Travel has been suspended throughout the nearby Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness. While there has been destruction of property, no lives have been lost.

I've been watching the forest change over most of my adult life. I've paddled past smoldering islands following fires of the past. In the last several years, the forest has been filled with dead balsam. Budworm infestation has killed most of them, leaving a dry fuel load in the best of circumstances. Mix in the summer drought and our current situation is predictable.

Even if our cabin is preserved, the forest we return to will not be the same. Over twenty thousand acres have already burned and the fire has not been contained. It's going to be a season of grief and loss on Sand Lake.

Yet the forest will renew itself. Something about the forest wants to live-- and so the forest finds a way. It will be a changed forest. While many of the geographic features of the area are timeless, the living forest is always in some season of change, but usually not this dramatic.

We as a church are in a season of change. The pandemic has affected how we do church in dramatic ways. While we have returned to in-person worship, attendance has been in the 30-60 range. Meanwhile, online worship continues to hover between 90-120 on the churches Facebook and YouTube channels. I've had several conversations with people who are not ready to resume in-person worship. Sometimes this is due to COVID, and sometimes because people have adjusted to and enjoy online worship. Even if the pandemic was over, we would not be returning to the church as we have known it.

Yet like the forest, the church is a living being. Facing adaptive challenges, your church family is adjusting and adapting to the changing human landscape. While change is unavoidable, we also trust the timeless qualities of God's love to persist with us on the path to abundant life. I believe the "life which wants to live" I love within the forest is a movement of the Holy Spirit. Our church family embodies the Holy Spirit this way. We want to live. How we do this continues to change, and in some ways, will never be the same. But we are adapting and adjusting along with the Holy Spirit in this season of our communal life. It is a great challenge, and also a great adventure.

So I am asking you, and it is a big ask, to recommit yourself to the living entity we call our church family. In whatever adaptive way we continue together, bring your prayers, presence, gift, service, and witness to your church in gratitude for the abundant life God is giving us through Jesus Christ.


May we live abundantly. May we hope faithfully. May we love joyfully.


